## K. SMITH AND J. MILBURN TIE AT DENTON

Fifty-six players came to the Holiday Inn in Denton this June to participate in the Third Annual Denton Open.

Kenneth Smith drew his fourth round game with Jerry Milburn. Both scored  $4\frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$ , but Smith received the First Place trophy on the tie-break.

Eric Bone won his first four games to take a half-point lead into the final round. He was paired with Smith, who overtook him with a Bone crusher due to a blunder.

Others who scored 4-1 were John Hall and Robert Brieger; also Roy DeVault and Lynn Green, who split the prize awarded to the top Class A player.

The Class B award went to Fred Pennington who came through with a fine  $3\frac{1}{2}-1\frac{1}{2}$  performance.

Best Class C players were Doyle Saylor and J. Walter Long with 3-2 game scores. Tibor Rekey, our wonderful chess friend, organized and directed this tournament. See inside page for the complete cross table.

## 1967 BIG D CHESS TOURNAMENT by Kenneth R. Smith

It was quite impressive to watch the entry list grow to a large 64 players here at Dallas. They came from all over; Mexico, Oklahoma, Kansas, Louisiana, Texas, Washington, New Jersey, and as far away as Canada. Here are a few comments on the players and the tournament.

### 1st Ken Smith 5-0

I was well pleased by my play in this tournament. The only excitement came in the fourth round vs. John Dunning, San Antonio, where in a won position I moved a little too fast and allowed a position where I would have to let John have a perpetual check, or to stop it, sac my Queen. Since he was short of time, I went for the Queen sac, and the position ended up with me having two Rooks vs. his Queen and Knight with a lot of pawns on the board.

## SCHUTT STARS IN SOUTHERN OPEN

Space city shining star, Schutt cinched second in Southern Schachspiel. Actually Ray Schutt tied for First Place, as he was undefeated with a score of 6 - 1. Six shooter, Schutt shot down Southern stars in the seven round Swiss held July 1-4 in Birmingham, Alabama. His victims included Florida Master, Juan Gonzalez, who also scored 6 - 1, and received the First Place trophy because of superior tie-breaking points. He also defeated Master, Milan Momic, and experts, Jude Acers and Dr. Carlyle. Another Houston player, Robert Chalker enjoyed the chess competition, but did not share Schutt's success.

### Big D Comments by Ken Smith

In this won position Dunning offered me a draw, and it must have been my refusal that caused him to slip into a mating net. The rest of my games were short, sharp attacks that netted the point.

### 2nd Ed Formanek and Lynn Green $4\frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$

Most of Formanek's games were long drawn out endings, where the master was able to outplay his opponent. Ed's major strength lies in his endgame play; in fact he could be called the "Capa" of the cattle country. Only a slight oversight stopped him from winning from John Jacobs and tying for First with a 5-0.

Lynn Green is one of the State's (and Dallas!) up and coming players. He has a solid style and is hard to beat. Some said that he was lucky in a couple of games, but it must be realized that luck is created by hard, fighting chess.

### 3rd, 4th, 5th, John Jacobs, John Grefe, Tibor Rekey 4-1

The Texas Jr. Champion, John Jacobs, is showing that he is a future force to be reckoned with for top honors in a tournament. We look for a great showing from him in the coming U.S. Jr. Open Tournament. This boy at 16 years of age is already near master strength.

# Big D Comments by Ken Smith

John Grefe is to be welcomed to Texas chess, and his USCF rating of 2196 will add strength to our tournaments. Grefe is from New Jersey, and is stationed with the armed forces here in Texas. He has a very clear active style and works at the chess board to indeed see a lot of chess. Tibor Rekey is well known for chess promotional activities; but this great showing will add to his stature as an over the board player. His ever sharp attacking style did him well in this tournament. If Tibor would improve his openings, he would always be a threat to the top of the tournament.

## A few of the other players

Mexico sent Arturo Jasso. He knocked off Jacobs with a draw, and lost a won game to Green. Otherwise he would have finished better than 7th place. A very strong player. And to the rest of Mexico's players, please come again.

Fred Pennington has improved! Beware of him in future tourneys.

Robert Garver is back in Texas, and this strong player's poor showing is due to very poor opening play. He must improve this to play up to the potential he has.

Roy DeVault has the makings of a very good player. His solid style is hard to beat. Watch him in the next tournament.

## Tournament Director

Jim Campion did an excellent job. There were no disputes, and he ran the tournament with a firm hand. The few pairing mistakes he has made in the past did not show up here. He is on his way to being one of the top directors for Southwestern chess.

## Comments

The prize fund came under some discussion. Especially since Class A prize was more than 2nd place. I believe this kept many strong players away, and a future adjustment should be made. But it is hard to knock success, and this tournament was a big one.
